

Postdoctoral Fellowship Opportunity at Western Law

Western's Postdoctoral Fellowships (PDF) Program

provides funding to postdoctoral fellows who will contribute positively to research excellence at the university and help advance Western's strategic research plan (<https://strategicplan.uwo.ca>).

Western's PDF Program seeks to attract top-tier postdoctoral talent, nationally and internationally; develop their leadership potential; and position them for success as tomorrow's research leaders, all the while taking into consideration:

- ***Interdisciplinary Collaboration***: Western is committed to supporting high-quality interdisciplinary collaborative research;
- ***Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI)***: Western is committed to supporting high-quality research projects involving designated groups that adhere to all relevant EDI principles, guidelines, and policies adopted by the university; and
- ***Promoting Indigenous Research***: Western is committed to supporting high-quality research projects by and/or with Indigenous Peoples (as outlined in Western's *Indigenous Strategic Plan: Goal 4 - Achieve Excellence in Indigenous Research & Scholarship*) that use either community-engagement research methodology, or traditional disciplinary methodologies.

Fellowships will provide a minimum stipend of \$45,000/year, 13% benefits, and a 1.5% stipend increase in year 2, for a total value of \$102,464 over 2 years. **The deadline for applications is 4:00PM on Tuesday, November 9, 2021.**
